The grant application process is relatively quick and easy. Assistance is speedy, strictly confidential and requires no repayment. QCS grant applications are reviewed only by your local chapter Investigative Committee and Governing Board, and all information is held in the strictest of confidence. The names of grant recipients are never shared, published or otherwise disseminated in any form.

Any QCS member or surviving dependent spouse, child or parent may be eligible to receive financial assistance. Financial assistance is provided in the form of grants not loans.

What can be covered by a QCS Grant?

Grants are intended to help those without the resources to meet an immediate and specific need, not as support for ongoing expenses.



Damage or loss of a residence that is not covered by insurance.



Expenses for critical household needs such as utility bills, groceries and clothing.



Medical or Dental not covered by private insurance or Medicare.

This category covers a wide variety of needs. Here are some examples of honored grants.

- * The cost of a medical procedure
- * Coverage during Medicare “donut hole” prescription time
- * Purchase of a new pair of reading glasses or a hearing aid
- * Repairing a cracked tooth or replacing damaged dentures
- * Purchase of a wheelchair or installation of a home handicap ramp
- * Travel related costs for outpatient treatment, such as transportation, hotels and meals.

Damage or loss from an Act of God include:

- * Flood
- * Hurricane
- * Tornado
- * Lightning Strike
- * Hail Storms

Damage or loss from accidental or sudden incidents include:

- * Fire
- * Burst pipes
- * Electrical power surge

Structural damage from hidden causes include:

- * Insect damage
- * Leaking septic systems



Funeral expenses for a member or member’s dependent spouse, child or parent.

The needs listed in this brochure are provided as examples. If you are not sure if a particular need meets the eligibility requirements for a grant, please don’t hesitate to ask!

The Society is a private, self-funded non-profit foundation, not a part of International Paper. All employees, both active and retired, who have attained at least 25 years of full-time employment with the company are automatically members. Maximum yearly grant is \$3,000 and a lifetime grant is \$10,000. Grants of \$599 or more per year must be reported to the IRS.
